New Jersey FFA Safe Tractor Operations Event

I. Purpose

The purpose of the New Jersey FFA Safe Tractor Operations Event is to provide an opportunity for students to exhibit safe tractor and equipment operation practices as well as showcase skills in tractor driving, equipment use and general knowledge through the agricultural education curriculum and to encourage experiential learning through use of practical skills and applied knowledge and provide recognition for those who have demonstrated skills and competencies as a result of instruction in tractor and equipment use and safety.

II. Objectives

- A. To instill leadership and motivate learning in the classroom through development of student skills in cooperative learning, observation, analysis and communication.
- B. To develop and exercise competitive spirit.
- C. To create a foundation for career choices by building an awareness of opportunities within tractor and equipment safety.
- D. To advance knowledge in tractor and equipment use, maintenance and safety.
- E. To provide the opportunity to demonstrate proper safety use of tractors and equipment.

III. State Core Curriculum Content Standards (CCCS)

Through Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources Education, FFA helps students meet the Common Core Standards and State Core Curriculum Content Standards. The Safe Tractor Operations Event helps students meet 21st Century Life and Careers – Career & Technical Education skills (9.3). Examples of how the Safe Tractor Operations Event is meeting these standards are:

Pathway: Power, Structural & Technical Systems (AG-PST)

9.3.12.AG-PST.2 – Operate and maintain AFNR mechanical equipment and power systems.

IV. Event Rules

*See the CDE rules section in the overall event handbook for additional rules. *

- A. Two individuals per school/chapter may be entered as an official contestant.
- B. The contest will consist of five parts, each of which will be scored separately.
- C. Contestants shall wear proper attire boots, work clothes, long pants, and a shirt with sleeves (not cut-off). Gloves can be worn, if desired.
- D. Tractors and equipment will be provided for each event. All contestants will use the same tractor and piece of equipment for each event.
- E. Situations occurring that are not covered in the rules will be decided by the judges.
- F. The contestant with the lowest total deductions will be the winner.
- G. All contestants MUST submit a signed waiver at least one-week prior to the event. Waivers will NOT be accepted on site.

V. Event Format

This event will be broken into five parts: A written test, a two-wheeled manure spreader event, a four-wheel trailer event, tractor loader event and a skid-loader event.

A. Written Test - Part I

- 1. The written test will include fifty (50) questions involving but not limited to skill, safe operation and operator maintenance of tractors, skid loaders and equipment.
- 2. The test will include true-false, completion and/or multiple-choice questions.

B. Operating Skills Events

The next four events will test the skill and ability of the contestant to operate skid-loaders, tractors and equipment safely.

Part II - Two-Wheel Manure Spreader Event

Part III - 4-Wheel Wagon Event

Part IV - Tractor Loader Event

Part V - Skid-Steer Event

- 1. Each contestant will start off with a visual inspection of skid-loader, tractors and equipment. Judges will expect a verbal response.
- 2. The contestant will follow the course outlined by the judge (see attached illustrations).
- 3. Time starts on a signal from the judge and stops when the contestant returns to original point.
- 4. The contestant will be allowed a maximum of ten minutes for each event. Less time used equals less deductions. The contestant will be notified at eight minutes that two minutes are left. If the contestant does not finish the event in ten minutes, the judge will stop the contestant and an additional 500-point deduction will be added to their score.
- 5. Excessive tractor brake steering will disqualify the contestant from the event.
- 6. Contestants may be disqualified if they are observed not following safety standards, which may endanger themselves, the judges or the public.
- 7. See scorecard for deductions.
- 8. The Tractor Loader event will involve loading two buckets of mulch and dumping.
- 9. The Skid-Steer event will use pallet forks to move loaded pallets around a course. One pallet will have four five-gallon buckets of sand, while the other has a five-gallon bucket of water.
- 10. Pinning of the 4 wheel wagon will be done by the operator.

NOTE*** CONTESTANTS WILL BE STOPPED BY THE JUDGE WAIVING A RED FLAG IF IT IS FELT THAT THE CONTESTANT IS NOT IN FULL CONTROL OF THE SKID-LOADER OR TRACTOR AND SAFETY OF THE OPERATOR AND JUDGES ARE JEOPARDIZED! CONTESTANTS WILL RECEIVE AN ADDITIONAL 500 POINT DEDUCTION!

VI. Awards

Awards will be presented following the event to individuals based upon their rankings in the event. A state sponsored banner will be awarded to the first place individual. Medals (gold, silver, bronze) will be awarded to the top three individuals in the overall event. H.O. Sampson Certificates ($1^{st} - 5^{th}$) will be awarded to the top five individuals in the hands-on practicum areas only. Awards are sponsored by the New Jersey FFA Foundation, Inc., the New Jersey State FFA Association, and/or the National FFA Organization. The first place individual will represent New Jersey at the Big E in September.




COURSE LAYOUT - TWO WHEEL MANURE SPREADER EVENT


COURSE LAYOUT - FOUR WHEEL TRAILER EVENT
