VIII. State FFA Alumni & Supporters Association Report

On February 12, Owen, Nicole and Talia reported on their trip to Spain and Portugal for ILSSO. Members discussed the golf tournament at the Gambler's Ridge Golf Course. The Alumni created a social media challenge for national FFA week. The Alumni is also hosting a fundraiser for State convention to compile an ad book.

IX. Food, Agriculture, & Natural Resources Education Advisory Council Report

Members were able to hear from the Department of Education and heard updates on the current program reapprovals. Rutgers announced updates on the agricultural education program. The New Jersey FFA Association is invited to bring a table and officers to share information about the association and the National FFA Organization.

XII. New Jersey Association for Agricultural Educators

At the last meeting members discussed membership awards and issues. They also began to talk about the constitution and bylaws along with the nominating committee. They discussed the ag education resolution that passed at the Ag Convention. The next meeting will be on March 12.

XIII. Unfinished Business

a. New Jersey Agricultural Convention

The officer team was able to attend the Food, Agriculture, & Natural Resources Education Advisory Council meeting, watch Jamie Specca present her speech, and networked with Agriculture Youth Ambassadors and helped escort the ambassadors during the dinner ceremony.

b. Fuel Up Retreat

On February 20-23, officers spent the time in Little Egg Harbor where they were able to prepare for state convention, planned sessions, worked on their retiring addresses and practiced their ceremonies.

c. Advocacy and Legislative Leadership Day

Students were able to meet with various colleges/universities, USDA representatives, Jersey Fresh, and our Teach AG campaign. The symposium included many guest speakers and a panel on how to live your legacy through agriculture. After lunch, students broke out into three different groups to discover their passions, why they want to advocate for it, and how.

d. National FFA Week

Officers travelled around New Jersey supporting and promoting FFA with various chapters and events, from cooking to hosting a petting zoo. The Association created a social media challenge throughout the week and hosted the Advocacy and Legislative Leadership Day.

e. National Ag Day Event

Jamie Specca will be travelling down to Washington D.C. to meet with fellow FFA and 4H members and leaders. She was able to schedule two visits with staff of Senator Booker and Senator Menendez to share more about the opportunities that FFA has to offer students through various agriculture industries all while strengthening student's skill sets for their futures.

f. Horticultural Exposition/Floral Design CDE

Hort Expo will be held March 13-14 at the Mercer County Community College. Officers will set up on Thursday March 12 and are working in shifts on the 13-14 to help clean up/organize products. Ms. Dowd brought attention to that officers will need to arrive at the community college at 3:30 pm on the 12th to set up tables, create an information table. On Friday, Jamie will lead the judges orientation, and Nicole will help assist with the Floral Design CDE. Each officer will serve as judges' assistants. Tess Siebel, the Eastern Region Vice President will attend and present a leadership workshop along with our past alumni.

c. Delegate Issues

Officers discussed how New Jersey's Association's Constitution and Bylaws are currently in line with National FFA's Constitution and Bylaws. For each officer's personal committee, they need to plan a meeting and discuss future topics for the 2020 State Convention

d. State-Wide Community Service Project

The officers have determined that the project will be to collect materials to be packed into First Night kits.
